


TRAPPERS' STATIONS



Hamna [208-2], 17th August 2006. Hamna is a former Norwegian trappers' station, built in 1939 by Søren Richter's Expeditions. It was used as a trappers' station until 1951, and subsequently as a travellers' hut. Hamna is still in good condition, thanks to regular maintenance by personnel from Mestersvig Airfield. 1929-30

As early as 1921, Johan F. Petersen, who was a trapper in the East Greenland Company, had suggested that a trappers' station be built west of Kap Rink on Hochstetter Forland. On the 20th August 1929, the idea became a reality when the vessel "Birkild" anchored up, and the Nanok men aboard set about unloading materials for the station. When the ship left, Hans Ludvig Jensen, James van Hauen and Knud Østergaard remained behind to build the station under the leadership of Niels Hansen.

On the 30th August they raised the roof and Jensen recorded that: "we wrote a letter, signed with the names of the participants and put it in the north-eastern corner of the house. We named the house "Nanok" in commemoration of our company".¹⁵⁴ On September 17th they moved into the house which was: "good and
